#### All referrals need to be made on the South West Healthcare (SWH) Day Stay Unit Referral Form

The SWH Day Stay Unit (DSU) offers treatment for patients who do not usually require an overnight hospital admission but require intravenous medication for medical conditions, venesections, blood transfusions and other specialist medical treatment requiring a day admission. Patients are only admitted for the length of treatment and required monitoring time, then discharged home the same day.

Patients referred for certain radiological-guided procedure <u>do require</u> an overnight hospital admission. In these instances, the patient is transferred to the SWH Short Stay Unit following their procedure. These procedures include:

- All lung biopsies
- All intra-peritoneal biopsies
- All pleural drainages
- All ascetic taps
- All therapeutic lumbar puncture procedures e.g. for intracranial hypertension

All planned referrals (for infusions and radiological-guided procedures as listed above) require the Day stay Unit Referral Form to be submitted to the SWH DSU. To optimize patient safety, only complete referrals with the relevant clinical information, will be accepted. Incomplete referrals will be sent back to the referring doctor with a request for additional information.

#### **GENERAL EXCLUSIONS (for specific conditions: see below)**

- Acutely unwell patients refer to Emergency Department
- Non-Medicare eligible patients
- Patients < 18 years old

The following tables provides a guide for what is required to allow triage of the referral and outlines the referral management process:
